SubhanAllah, wal-hamdulillah, wa la illaha ill-Allah, wa Allahu Akbar, wa la hawla wa la quwwata illa Billahil-aliy al-azim

Translation:- Glory be to Allah, praise be to Allah, there is none worthy of worship except Allah, Allah is Most Great, and there is no power and no strength except with Allah the Exalted and Magnificent.

La ilaha illallahu wahdahu la sharika lahu; Allahu Akbar kabiran, wal-hamdu lillahi kathiran, wa subhan-Allahi Rabbil-'alamin; wa la hawla wa la quwwata illa billahil-'Azizil-Hakim

Translation:- There is no true god except Allah the One and He has no partner with Him; Allah is the Greatest and greatness is for Him. All praise is due to Him. Allah, the Rubb of the worlds is free from imperfection; there is no might and power but that of Allah, the All-Powerful and the All-Wise.

In the end recite :- **Allahummaghfir li, warhamni, wahdini, warzuqni**

Translation:- O Allah! Grant me pardon, have mercy upon me, direct me to righteousness and provide me subsistence.

Al-hamdu Lillahi kathiran (3 times)

Translation:- Much praise is to Allah

Subhan Allahi bukratan wa asilan (3 times)

Translation:- Glory is to Allah morning and evening

Allahumma inni a'udhu bika minash-Shaitanir-rajim, min hamzihi wa nafkhihi wa nafthihi

Translation:- O Allah, I seek refuge in You from the accursed Satan, from his madness, his poetry, and his pride.

Hadith: The Narrator's father saw the Messenger of Allah (ﷺ) when he started the prayer , He (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) used to say the above dhikr.

Subhan-Allahi 'adada ma khalaqa fis-sama (Subhan-Allah,equal to the number of what He created in the heaven)

wa subhan-Allahi 'adada ma khalaqa fil-ardi (Subhan-Allah,equal to the number of what He created in the earth)

wa subhan-Allahi 'adada ma baina dhalika (Subhan-Allah,equal to the number in between them)

wa subhan-Allahi 'adada ma Huwa Khaliqun (Subhan-Allah equal to the number of those He will create)

After this you have to repeat all of the above dhikr BUT REPLACE Subhan-Allah with

1. **Allahu Akbar** (Allah is Greatest)
2. Then with **Al-hamdu lillah** (praise be to Allah)
3. Then with **La ilaha illallah** (there is no true god except Allah)
4. Then with **La hawla wa la quwwata illa billah** (there is no change of a condition nor power except by Allah)

Translation:- There is no true god except Allah. He is One and He has no partner with Him. His is the sovereignty and His is the praise, and He is Omnipotent.

Hadith:- The one who recites the above **after every prayer** will have all his sins pardoned even if they may be as large as the foam on the surface of the sea."

Virtues of Reciting “Subhan-Allah” , “Al-hamdu lillah” and “Allahu Akbar”

1st Hadith:-

It was narrated from Nu'man bin Bashir that :

the Messenger of Allah (ﷺ) said: "What you mention of glory of Allah, of Tabsih (Subhan-Allah), Tahlil (Allahu-Akbar) and Tahmid (Al-Hamdu lillah), **revolves around the Throne**, buzzing like bees, reminding of the one who said it. Wouldn't anyone of you like to have, or continue to have, something that reminds of him (in the presence of Allah)?"

2nd Hadith:-

It was narrated from Abu Malik Ash'ari that:

The Messenger of Allah said: "**Performing ablution properly is half of faith, saying Al-Hamdu Lillah fills the Scale (of good deeds), saying Subhan-Allah and Allahu Akbar fills the heavens and the earth, prayer is light, Zakat is proof, patience is brightness and**

the Qur'an is proof for you or against you. Every person goes out in the morning to sell his soul, so he either frees it or destroys it."

3rd Hadith:-

Ibn Mas'ud (May Allah be pleased with him) reported:

Messenger of Allah (ﷺ) said, "I met Ibrahim (ﷺ) on the Night of Ascension (Al-Asra), and he said to me: 'O Muhammad, convey my greetings to your Ummah, and tell them that Jannah has a vast plain of pure soil and sweet water. It is a plain levelled land. **The plants grow there by uttering: Subhan-Allah, Al-hamdu lillah, La ilaha illallah and Allahu Akbar** (Allah is free from imperfection; praise be to Allah; there is no true god except Allah; and Allah is Greatest)."

4th Hadith:-

Abu Dharr (May Allah be pleased with him) reported:

The Messenger of Allah (ﷺ) said, "Every morning charity is due from every joint bone of the body of every one of you. Every utterance of Allah's Glorification (i.e., Subhan-Allah) is an act of charity, and every utterance of praise of Him (i.e., Al-hamdu lillah) is an act of charity, and every utterance of profession of Faith (i.e., La ilaha illallah) is an act of charity, and every utterance of His Greatness (i.e., Allahu Akbar) is an act of charity; and enjoining good is an act of charity and forbidding what is disreputable is an act of charity; and two Rak'ah prayer which one offers in the forenoon (Ad- Duha) will suffice for all this."

5th Hadith:-

Narrated Abu Huraira:

Allah 's Apostle said, "Allah has some angels who look for those who celebrate the Praises of Allah on the roads and paths. And when they find some people celebrating the Praises of Allah, they call each other, saying, "Come to the object of your pursuit.' " He added, "Then the angels encircle them with their wings up to the sky of the world." He added. "(after those people celebrated the Praises of Allah, and the angels go back), their Lord, asks them (those angels)----though He knows better than them----'What do My slaves say?' The angels reply, 'They say: Subhan Allah, Allahu Akbar, and Alham-du-li l-lah, Allah then says 'Did they see Me?' The angels reply, 'No! By Allah, they didn't see You.' Allah says, How it would have been if they saw Me?' The angels reply, 'If they saw You, they would worship You more devoutly and celebrate Your Glory more deeply, and declare Your freedom from any resemblance to anything more often.' Allah says (to the angels), 'What do they ask Me for?' The angels reply, 'They ask You for Paradise.' Allah says (to the angels), 'Did they see it?' The angels say, 'No! By Allah, O Lord! They did not see it.' Allah says, How it would have been if they saw it?' The angels say, 'If they saw it, they would have greater covetousness for it and would seek It with greater zeal and would have greater desire for it.' Allah says, 'From what do they seek refuge?' The angels reply, 'They seek refuge from the (Hell) Fire.' Allah says, 'Did they see it?' The angels say, 'No By Allah, O Lord! They did not see it.' Allah says, How it would have been if they saw it?' The

angels say, 'If they saw it they would flee from it with the extreme fleeing and would have extreme fear from it.' **Then Allah says, 'I make you witnesses that I have forgiven them.'**" Allah's Messenger (ﷺ) added, "One of the angels would say, 'There was so-and-so amongst them, and he was not one of them, but he had just come for some need.' Allah would say, 'These are those people whose companions will not be reduced to misery.' "

Translation:- Allah is Greatest

Subhan-Allah (10 times)

Translation:- Glory is to Allah

Istaghfir-Allah (10 times)

Translation:- Allah , forgive me.

Allahummaghfirli, wahdini, warzuqni, wa'afini

Translation:- O Allah, forgive me, guide me, grant me provision and give me good health.

Hadith:- Messenger of Allah (peace and blessing of Allah be upon him) would **start Qiyam Al-Lail after reciting the above dhikr.**

It was narrated that 'Ubadah bin As-Samit said:

"The Messenger of Allah (ﷺ) said: 'Whoever **wakes up in the morning** and says upon waking:

La ilaha illallah wahdahu la sharika lahu, lahul-mulku wa lahul-hamdu, wa Huwa 'ala kulli shay'in Qadir; Subhan-Allah walhamdu lillahi, wa la ilaha illallahu, wa Allahu Akbar, wa la hawla wa la quwwata illa billahil-'Aliyil-'Azim

Translation:- (None has the right to be worshipped but Allah alone, with no partner or associate. His is the dominion and all praise is to Him, and He is Able to do all things. Glory is to Allah, praise is to Allah, none has the right to be worshiped but Allah, Allah is the Most Great, and there is no power and no strength except with Allah, the Most High, the Most Supreme)

Then he supplicates **Rabbighfirli** (O Lord, forgive me), **he will be forgiven.**

Walid said: "Or he said: then **if he supplicated, it will be answered for him**

then **if he stood up and performed ablution and then performed prayer, his prayer would be accepted.**"

Narrated 'Ubada bin As-Samit:

The Prophet (ﷺ) "Whoever gets up at night and says: -- '

La ilaha il-lallah Wahdahu la Sharika lahu Lahu-Imulk, waLahu-l-hamd wahuwa 'ala kullishai'in Qadir. Al hamdu lil-lahi wa subhanal-lahi wa la-ilaha il-lal-lah wa-l-lahu akbar wa la hawla Wala Quwata il-la-bil-lah.'

Translation:- None has the right to be worshipped but Allah. He is the Only One and has no partners . For Him is the Kingdom and all the praises are due for Him. He is Omnipotent. All the praises are for Allah. All the glories are for Allah. And none has the right to be worshipped but Allah, And Allah is Great And there is neither Might nor Power Except with Allah.

And then says: -- **Allahumma, Ighfir li** (O Allah! Forgive me). **Or invokes (Allah), he will be responded to and if he performs ablution (and prays), his prayer will be accepted."**

It was narrated that Abu Rafi' said:

"The Messenger of Allah (ﷺ) said to 'Abbas: 'O uncle, shall I not give you a gift, shall I not benefit you, shall I not uphold my ties of kinship with you?' He said: 'Of course, O Messenger of Allah.' He said: '**Pray four Rak'ah, and recite in each Rak'ah the Opening of the Book (Al-Fatihah) and a Surah. When you have finished reciting, say: Subhan-Allah wal-hamdu Lillah wa la ilaha illallah wa Allahu Akbar** (Glory is to Allah, praise is to Allah, none has the right to be worshipped but Allah and Allah is the Most Great) **fifteen times before you bow in Ruku'. Then bow and say it ten times; then raise your head and say it ten times; then prostrate and say it ten times; then raise your head and say it ten times; then prostrate and say it ten times; then raise your head and say it ten times before you stand up.**

That will be seventy-five times in each Rak'ah and

three hundred times in the four Rak'ah,

and even if your sins are like the grains of sand, Allah will forgive you for them.'

He said: 'O Messenger of Allah, what if someone cannot say it in one day?' He said: 'Then say it **once in a week; if you cannot, then say it once in a month'** until he said: '**Once in a year.'**'"

The Messenger of Allah (ﷺ) said, "He who says: 'Astaghfir ullah-alladhi la ilaha illa Huwal-Haiyul-Qayyumu, wa atubu ilaihi (I seek the forgiveness of Allah, there is no true god except Allah, the Ever-Living, the Self- Subsisting, and I turn to Him in repentance),' his sins will

be forgiven even if he should have run away from the battlefield (while he was engaged in fighting for the Cause of Allah)."

Narrated Shaddad bin Aus:

The Prophet (ﷺ) said "The most superior way of asking for forgiveness from Allah is: 'Allahumma anta Rabbi la ilaha illa anta, Anta Khalaqtani wa ana `Abduka, wa ana 'ala ahdika wa wa'dika mastata'tu, A`udhu bika min Sharri ma sana'tu, abu'u Laka bini'matika 'alaiya, wa abu'u laka bidhanbi faghfir lee fa innahu la yaghfiru adhdhunuba illa anta.'" The Prophet (ﷺ) added. "If somebody recites it during the day with firm faith in it, and dies on the same day before the evening, he will be from the people of Paradise; and if somebody recites it at night with firm faith in it, and dies before the morning, he will be from the people of Paradise."
